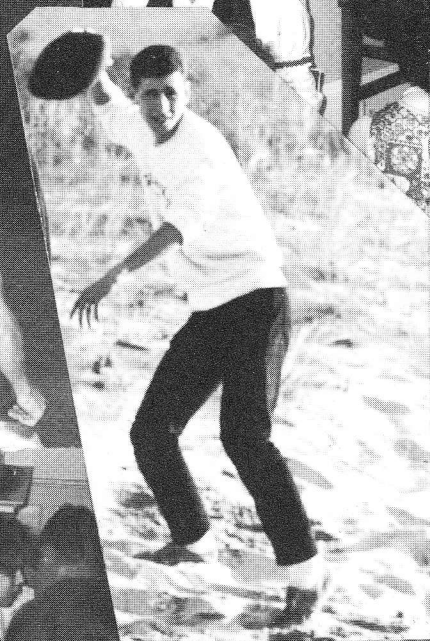
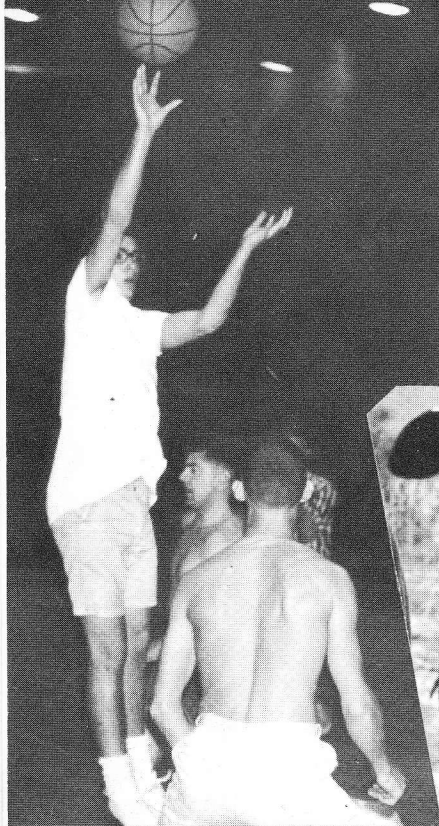
## SCHOLARSHIP

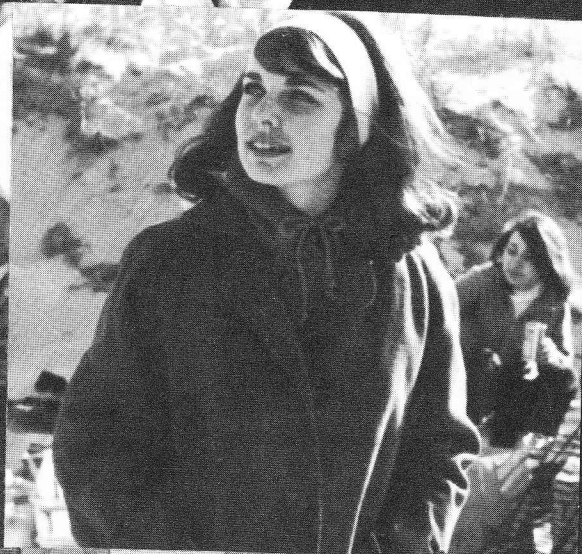
